

# TPS543B20, 25-A Single Phase Synchronous Step-Down Converter

This user's guide describes the characteristics, operation, and use of the TPS543B20 Evaluation Module (EVM). The user's guide includes test information, descriptions, and results. A complete schematic diagram, printed-circuit board layouts, and bill of materials are also included in this document. Throughout this user's guide, the abbreviations EVM, TPS543B20EVM-799, and the term evaluation module are synonymous with the TPS543B20, unless otherwise noted.

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# 1 Introduction

The PWR799EVM evaluation module uses the TPS543B20 device. The TPS543B20 is a highly integrated synchronous buck converter that is designed for up to 25-A current output.

### 1.1 Before You Begin

The following warnings and cautions are noted for the safety of anyone using or working close to the TPS543B20. Observe all safety precautions.



Warning

The TPS543B20 circuit module may become hot during operation due to dissipation of heat. Avoid contact with the board. Follow all applicable safety procedures applicable to your laboratory.

Caution

Do not leave the EVM powered when unattended.

# WARNING

The circuit module has signal traces, components, and component leads on the bottom of the board. This may result in exposed voltages, hot surfaces or sharp edges. Do not reach under the board during operation.

### CAUTION

The circuit module may be damaged by over temperature. To avoid damage, monitor the temperature during evaluation and provide cooling, as needed, for your system environment.

### CAUTION

Some power supplies can be damaged by application of external voltages. If using more than 1 power supply, check your equipment requirements and use blocking diodes or other isolation techniques, as needed, to prevent damage to your equipment.

### CAUTION

The communication interface is not isolated on the EVM. Be sure no ground potential exists between the computer and the EVM. Also be aware that the computer is referenced to the Battery- potential of the EVM.

# 2 Description

The PWR799EVM is designed as a single output DC-DC converter that demonstrates the TPS543B20 in a typical low-voltage application while providing a number of test points to evaluate the performance. It uses a nominal 12-V input bus to produce a regulated 0.9-V output at up to 25-A load current.



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#### 5 Test Equipment

**Voltage Source:** The input voltage source VIN must be a 0-V to 20-V variable DC source capable of supplying at least 10  $A_{DC}$ . Also, the output impedance of the external voltage source must be much less than 100 k $\Omega$ .




Figure 2. PWR799EVM Overview

**Multimeters:** It is recommended to use two separate multimeters Figure 2. One meter is used to measure  $V_{IN}$  and one to measure  $V_{OUT}$ .

**Output Load:** A variable electronic load is recommended for testing Figure 2. It must be capable of 25 A at voltages as low as 0.6 V.




Figure 3. Tip and Barrel Measurement

**Oscilloscope:** An oscilloscope is recommended for measuring output noise and ripple. Output ripple must be measured using a tip-and-barrel method or better as shown in Figure 3. The scope must be adjusted to 20-MHz bandwidth, AC coupling at 50 mV/division, and must be set to 1-µs/division.

**Fan:** During prolonged operation at high loads, it may be necessary to provide forced air cooling with a small fan aimed at the EVM. Temperature of the devices on the EVM must be maintained below 105°C.

**Recommended Wire Gauge:** The voltage drop in the load wires must be kept as low as possible in order to keep the working voltage at the load within its operating range. Use the AWG 14 wire (2 wires parallel for VOUT positive and 2 wires parallel for the VOUT negative) of no more than 1.98 feet between the EVM and the load. This recommended wire gauge and length should achieve a voltage drop of no more than 0.2 V at the maximum 25-A load.

### 8 Test Procedure

### 8.1 Line and Load Regulation Measurement Procedure

- 1. Connect VOUT to J2 and VOUT\_GND to J2 Figure 2.
- 2. Ensure that the electronic load is set to draw  $0 A_{DC}$ .
- 3. Ensure the jumper provided on the EVM shorts on J3 before  $V_{IN}$  is applied
- 4. Connect VIN to J1 and VIN\_GND to J1 Figure 2.
- 5. Increase  $V_{IN}$  from 0 V to 12 V using the digital multimeter to measure input voltage.
- 6. Remove the jumper on J3 to enable the controller.
- 7. Use the other digital multimeter or the oscilloscope to measure output voltage V<sub>OUT</sub> at TP3 and TP10.

- Vary the load from 0 A<sub>DC</sub> to maximum rated output 25 A<sub>DC</sub>. V<sub>OUT</sub> must remain in regulation as defined in Table 1.
- 9. Vary V<sub>IN</sub> from 5 V to 19 V. V<sub>OUT</sub> must remain in regulation as defined in Table 1.
- 10. Decrease the load to 0 A.
- 11. Put the jumper back on JP3 to disable the converter.
- 12. Decrease  $V_{IN}$  to 0 V or turn off the supply.

### 8.2 Efficiency

To measure the efficiency of the power train on the EVM, it is important to measure the voltages at the correct location. This is necessary because otherwise the measurements will include losses in efficiency that are not related to the power train itself. Losses incurred by the voltage drop in the copper traces and in the input and output connectors are not related to the efficiency of the power train, and they must not be included in efficiency measurements.

Input current can be measured at any point in the input wires, and output current can be measured anywhere in the output wires of the output being measured. Using these measurement points result in efficiency measurements that do not include losses due to the connectors and PCB traces.



Test Procedure

### 8.3 Equipment Shutdown

- 1. Reduce the load current to 0 A.
- 2. Reduce input voltage to 0 V.
- 3. Shut down the external fan if in use.
- 4. Shut down equipment.




Figure 4. Efficiency of 0.9-V Output vs Load




Figure 5. Power Loss of 0.9-V Output vs Load




Figure 6. Load Regulation of 0.9-V Output




Figure 7. Transient Response of 0.9-V Output at  $12\text{-}V_{\text{IN}},$  Transient is 10 A to 20 A to 10 A, at 40 A/µs




Figure 8. Output Ripple and SW Node of 0.9-V Output at 12-V<sub>IN</sub>, 20-A Output




Figure 9. Output Ripple and SW Node of 0.9-V Output at 12-V  $_{\mbox{\tiny IN}}$ , 0-A Output




Figure 10. Start up from Enable, 0.9-V Output at 12-V<sub>IN</sub>, 50-mA Output




Figure 11. Start up from Enable, 0.9-V Output at 12-V<sub>IN</sub>, 20-A Output




Figure 12. Output Voltage Start-up and Shutdown, 0.9-V Output at  $12-V_{IN}$ , 0.5-A Output




Figure 13. Thermal Image at 0.9-V Output at 12 V<sub>IN</sub>, 25-A Output, at 25°C Ambient




Figure 14. PWR799EVM Top Layer Assembly Drawing (Top View)




Figure 15. PWR799EVM Top Solder Mask (Top View)






Figure 16. PWR799EVM Top Layer (Top View)




Figure 17. PWR799EVM Inner Layer 1 (Top View)






Figure 18. PWR799EVM Inner Layer 2 (Top View)




Figure 19. PWR799EVM Inner Layer 3 (Top View)






Figure 20. PWR799EVM Inner Layer 4 (Top View)




Figure 21. PWR799EVM Bottom Layer (Top View)






Figure 22. PWR799EVM Bottom Solder Mask (Top View)




Figure 23. PWR799EVM Bottom Overlay Layer (Top View)

- 3.3.2 Notice for Users of EVMs Considered "Radio Frequency Products" in Japan: EVMs entering Japan may not be certified by TI as conforming to Technical Regulations of Radio Law of Japan.
