ABSTRACT

This application report shows how to use the XgxPerf toolkit to build and benchmark a Qt™ based application. It is assumed that you are familiar with installing and writing applications based on Qt.

2 XgxPerf

XgxPerf is a light-weight toolkit that you can use to build modular Qt applications that can be profiled. XgxPerf has two main components: the *Application Manager* and the *Application Base*.

The main uses of this toolkit are to profile, benchmark, and provide an example for optimized usage of Qt. It also adds tools like *livemem* used to capture screens at any point in time when the application is being executed. Optimized SVG classes for animation are provided.

XgxPerf is dependant on SVG and Webkit; Qt needs to be built with these options.

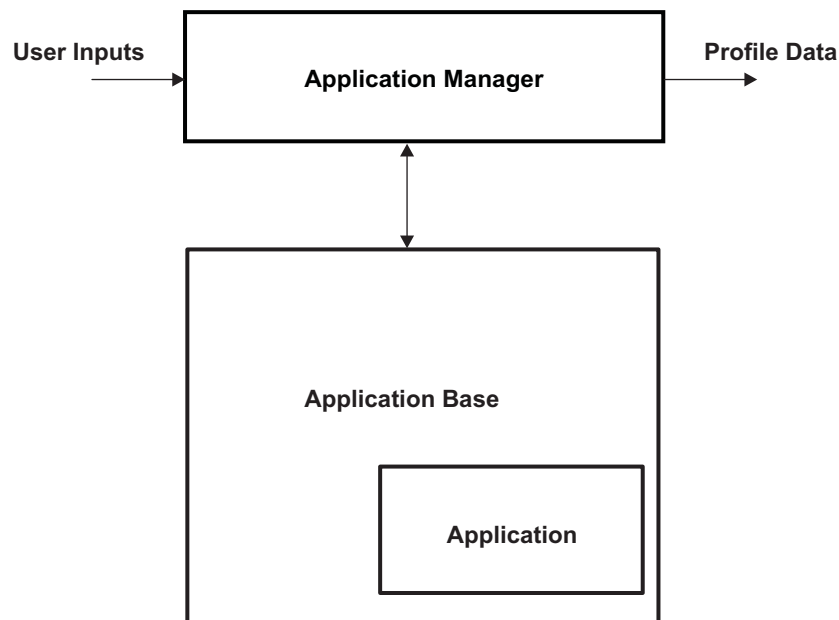


Figure 1. High-Level View of XgxPerf

2.1 Application Manager

Application manager acts as an interface between you and the actual Qt-based application. It has the option to load the actual Qt application and also to accept the relevant parameters via command line.

2.2 Application Base

Application base is a class used to profile the application's CPU bandwidth requirements. This class can be used in providing the startup time of the application, as well as the animation time.

`applicationmanager\common\applicationbase.h` provides the application base class. The base class provides `Init`, `Process`, `GetAppName`, `GetAppIcon`, `GetSwitchingTime` and calls.

- `Init`: initialize the widgets
- `Process`: timer-based process calls
The application manager configures the timer based on the `fps` set.
- `GetAppName`: returns the application name (deprecated)
- `GetAppIcon`: returns the icon for application (deprecated)
- `GetSwitchingTime`: returns the time interval for whichever process is called (deprecated)

3 How to Create an Application With XgxPerf

3.1 XgxPerf Package

The toolkit comes with an application manager package with the following components:

```
<INSTALL_PATH>\xgxperf\trunk\Packages\OMAP3_Graphics_SDK\xgxperf\xgxperf\applicationmanager

3.2 Creating a New Application

The application is built as a library. The application manager loads the application library into the target and waits for the execution to complete.

To create a new application:

1. Create a new cpp file say `helloworld.cpp`, create a new class from `applicationbase`.

createNewApp(QWidget* parent,

    return new HelloWrld(parent, inSceneRect, scene, data);
}

HelloWrld::HelloWrld(QWidget* parent, QRectF inSceneRect,
                    QGraphicsScene *scene, void* data):
ApplicationBase(parent, inSceneRect, scene, data)
{
    //Store the test data locally
    m_widgetTestInStruct = (TestTargetParamsStruct*)data;
}

QString HelloWrld::GetAppName(){return QString("HelloWrld");};
int HelloWrld::GetSwitchingTime()
{
    return (1000/m_widgetTestInStruct->rate_screen_refresh_fps);
};

2. Add the Init and process functions.

```

void HelloWrld::Init()
{
    pHelloVal = m_scene->addText("Hello World");
    pHelloVal->moveBy(200,200);
}

void HelloWrld::Process()
{
    pHelloVal->moveBy(5,5);
    //Indicate that the processing is complete
    SetProcessCallComplete();
}

```

3. Create a .pro file with the following:

```

TEMPLATE = lib
SOURCES = helloworld.cpp
HEADERS += ../applicationmanager/common/applicationbase.h

```

4. Build the application as follows:

```

qmake qt_e.pro
    This will create a Makefile based on the Qt configuration.
make

```

The libraries need to be installed in the `/usr/lib` folder. If you want to install the libraries in a different path, use `LD_LIBRARY_PATH` to set the library path.

3.3 Building the Application Manager

The application manager can be copied to the target folder where the actual application resides. To build the application manager for a particular target:

1. Go to the `applicationmanager\qt_e` folder
2. `qmake qt_e.pro`
3. `make`

The `qt_e` binary created at this step is the applicationmanager.

An example folder structure will look like:

```
--applicationmanager
--application_name
  --application_name.cpp
  --application_name.pro
```

3.4 Executing the Application

To execute the application:

```
#qt_e -qws <params>
```

params = Cookie, numWdgt, fx, transparency, texture, fontsize, fps, prebuiltID, wdgtsize, numFrames, appstring

example: `/qt_e -qws 123 3 0 0 0 0 10 99 512 100 "helloworld"`

Mandatory params:

- Cookie: number to be appended to the output file – example: 0,1,2
- fps: number of frames per second – example: 1,2
- numFrames: number of frames to run – example: 100,200
- appstring: name of the application library to run

Optional params:

- numWdgt – number of widgets in the application
- fx=0,1: enable/disable shadow to widgets when fx=1
- transparency: enable/disable transparency
- texture = 0,1,2: add a background texture 0-no; 1-PNG; 2-SVG
- fontsize – set font size: example: 8,16
- fontsize – set font size: example: 8,16 – set to 99 while executing custom application.
 - 0 – Industrial Automation blocks (Turbines, Boilers, Pipes, Text Info classes)
 - 1 – Text + Pictures (PNG/VG/Colors)
 - 2 – Involves GLWidget, needs powervr (not on HawkBoard)
 - 3 – Webkit Browser
 - 4 – Automotive Tacho
 - 5 – Medical ECG Monitor
 - 5 – Medical ECG Monitor
 - 7 – Sewing Machine UI
- wdgtsize – size of the widget: example:100,256,512

livemem

If a screen capture of the application is required, copy `get_screen_dump.sh` file from `\xgxperf\trunk\Packages\OMAP3_Graphics_SDK\xgxperf\server` to the folder where the application is installed.

4 Results and Interpreting

Once the Process call returns, the application manager saves the results in an xml file.

Table 1 shows an example result of the ECG monitor application on the OMAP3530 device.

Table 1. XgxPerf_Profile_Test_Inputs

Table 2 shows that it took 3 mS to start the application, once it was initiated. Prior to that, it was taking about 35 mS per frame with an average CPU load of 29% on OMAP3530.
